
















## INDIA'S MARITIME INDUSTRY

The Indian maritime sector plays a pivotal role in the economic growth of India. With a vast coastline of more than 7,500 km, India is among the largest maritime countries in the world. Being a part of the world's busiest trade route elevates the economic prominence of India's maritime sector. About 95% of India's foreign trade and 70% of its value takes place through seaways

Today, India is home to 12 major ports, over 200 ports other than major ports, 28 shipyards and a comprehensive hub of diverse maritime service providers.

#### **Ports**

- **2500+ MTPA of port capacity**
- Capacity Addition of 230 MTPA in last 9 years
- Impressive TAT of upto 0.9 days (JNPA) ahead of many leading maritime nations
- Enhancing competitiveness 54% of cargo at major ports is handled by private ports. INR 40,000 crore worth PPP projects operationalized
- Operating sustainability Over 100
   MW of wind and solar power capacity at major ports

#### **Shipping**

- INR 3,500 4,000 Cr (USD 500 million) of ship repair industry
- 20th largest ship building sector globally with rapid capability expansion
- 2nd largest in global ship recycling

The event includes an investor summit and an international exhibition to facilitate interaction and collaboration among the Indian and international maritime companies, policy makers, investors, and other stakeholders.


