Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, His Excellency Narendra Modi delivered a video message to the leadership and people of the People's Republic of Bangladesh at the main event marking the birth centenary of 'Bangabandhu' Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, father of the Bangladesh nation on 17 March 2020, held at Dhaka's historic Suhrawardy Udyan. Hon'ble Prime Minister was scheduled to visit Dhaka to participate in the celebrations at the invitation of Prime Minister of Bangladesh, Her Excellency Sheikh Hasina. However, the visit could not take place in view of the Corona Virus outbreak.
